Reformation Sunday

Today's Scripture Passages

**D**ear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love. This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us.

God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them. This is how love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment: In this world we are like Jesus. There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love.

We love because he first loved us. Whoever claims to love God yet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister, whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen. And he has given us this command: Anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister. — 1 John 4:7-12, 16b-21

**T**here are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.

Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit... All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.

Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many. — 1 Corinthians 12:4-8, 11-14

## **GIVING IS AT THE HEART OF THE CHRISTIAN LIFE**

It is an expression of thanksgiving, an act of faith, and an investment in growing God's kingdom on earth as it is in heaven. As we begin this time of reflection, we focus on the ultimate sacrifice of giving – the life of Christ, given for us.

Christ gave us his life. He also gave us His Spirit and many gifts to be used for the glory of God and in service to one another and the world. We are a community called to love one another and share our gifts that God's glory might be revealed.

### **IT IS AN ACT OF FAITH**

When we are challenged to grow in our giving, we are given an opportunity for spiritual growth.

Giving changes all who give. It often feels risky for those who stretch to new giving levels. But generous people experience a paradox: their gifts of time, talent, and money mysteriously deepen their own connection to God, even as the gifts reach out to others with help and hope. Givers find new meaning and purpose in their lives as they share their resources on behalf of God's work in the world. They also find themselves more deeply connected to one another.
