### *Celebrating Pads*

For 15 years our church has been the Saturday night site for PADS, providing a warm meal and safe shelter for some of the homeless in Lake County. So many of our members have been a part of this important ministry. We are especially grateful for the leadership of Cathy O'Brien.

Last week Cathy, our Lay Leader Steve Neil, Ruth Ross, and Pastor Steve met with some leaders at First Presbyterian Church, Libertyville to discuss their hosting the Saturday night PADS October through December, until our renovation project is complete. First Presbyterian has agreed now to help us in this way. We thank them wholeheartedly for being such good neighbors. What a blessing to have such wonderful brothers and sisters in Christ and partners in missions! Our fellowship in the "universal catholic Church" is tangible and quite real.

Our ministry of caring to people on the margins is important. We are the hands and feet of Christ. Jesus did say, "I was hungry and you gave me food to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me. I was naked and you gave me clothes to wear. I was sick and you took care of me... I assure you that when you have done this for the least of these my brothers and sisters, you have done it for me" (Matthew 25:36, 40).

Gary Haugen, an ardent Christ-follower and the President of International Justice Mission, has seen global poverty up close for the last two decades. Here's how Haugen describes what it means to be poor:

I recall the way an old history professor of mine defined poverty: He said the poor are the ones who can never afford to have any bad luck. They can't get an infection because they don't have access to any medicine. They can't get sick or miss their bus or get injured because they will lose their menial labor job if they don't show up for work. They can't misplace their pocket change because it's actually the only money they have left for food. They can't have their goats get sick because it's the only source of milk they have. On and on it goes. Of course the bad news is, everybody has bad luck. It's just that most of us have margins of resources and access to support that allow us to weather the storm, because we're not trying to live off \$2.00 a day.

## Saying 'Hi' and Introducing a Mission Opportunity

My husband Dean and I are brand new members at UMCL and we are delighted to find such a perfect fit for our family. One thing I love most about our new church home is its mission mindedness, both locally and globally. I have been doing medical mission work in Africa for 12 years and will soon be expanding my impact to western Ukraine.

As International Teams' Community Health and End Slavery Catalyst, I will be leading a humanitarian/medical team next spring to Uzhgorod, western Ukraine to address community health and End Slavery issues among the youth of the Roma (gypsy) communities surrounding Uzhgorod. The Roma children fall through the cracks in most public healthcare programs due to their lack of documentation status, birth certificates and prejudice against the Roma people in Ukraine. I found the public orphanages to be overcrowded, poorly run and under resourced. The youth who are aging out at 16 are at high risk for entering a life of crime and prostitution at the hands of corrupt Roma bosses.

One group home for girls run by a Christian couple rescues youth at risk and teaches life skills as well as education and instills hope through Christ with discipleship and Bible study. The following is a story I heard at the group home:

April was ten years old when her first picture was taken and she carries that worn photo with her today to remind her of God's goodness in rescuing her last year. In the photo she looks like a scruffy little boy who was used to fighting for everything she got at the government-run orphanage. Her hair was short, a scowl on her face spoke to her distrust of strangers as she protected herself daily, never knowing a mother's love or tenderness; she had been abandoned in a hospital after she was born. When April was 15, "Mama" Maria visited the teenage orphanage she lived in and shared an opportunity that brought hope to young April's heart; girls like her are at high risk for going into a life of prostitution, making money for ruthless Roma bosses who run the gypsy communities, preying on children who have few options for employment. I sat in Maria's kitchen listening to these stories with tears in my eyes. April told me about receiving her first dress at age 15 from Maria, and smiled tenderly as she relayed how "Mama" had shown her how to fix her hair and apply modest makeup before her first job interview months after she arrived. Her face glowed as she told me, "No one had ever told me before that I was beautiful... when I saw my face after Mama fixed me up, I started crying...I am not only beautiful in my face now, but I know that I am a precious daughter of God, who is the Master of the Universe. Can you imagine that this could happen to a nobody like me????!!!"

April and her 12 sisters in the group home went around the table that day, sharing with me their hopes and dreams for the future: one wanted to be a teacher, one a nurse, one wants to be a veterinarian, a fitness club owner and many other professions that will supply them with the means to earn a legal living and raise Christian families. They all have hope for a bright future.

There is so much opportunity for God's work here in western Ukraine and I share this information with you in the hope that there are some in our congregation who will want to know more. ### ANTI-STIGMA: DO YOU KNOW THE FACTS ABOUT MENTAL ILLNESS?

- ◆ An estimated 50 million Americans experience a mental disorder each year.
- ◆ Stigma is more than the use of a wrong word or action.
- ◆ People with mental illness would rather tell employers they committed a petty crime and went to jail, than admit they spent time in a psychiatric hospital or behavioral unit.
- ◆ Stigma keeps people from getting needed health services.

#### BE INFORMED:

Stigma is about disrespect and using negative labels to identify a person by the name of an illness. Stigma language reflects stereotypes and prejudice.

**Disrespectful:** Portraying a successful person with disabilities as “super human.”  
Using generic labels like retarded, mentally ill, crazy, lunatic, slow functioning, manic depression

**Respectful:** Person with a psychiatric or neurobiological disorder  
Person who has schizophrenia  
Person living with depression.

#### COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS ABOUT MENTAL ILLNESS:

**MYTH:** Young people and children don't suffer from mental illnesses.

**FACT:** It is estimated that more than 5 million young people in America experience a mental health disorder which severely disrupts their ability to function.

**MYTH:** People who need psychiatric care should be locked away in institutions.

**FACT:** Most people can lead good productive lives within their communities, thanks to a variety of care providers, programs, and/or medications.

**MYTH:** A person who has had a mental illness can never lead a normal life.

**FACT:** People with mental illnesses can recover. For example, Mike Wallace of “60 Minutes” lived with clinical depression, received treatment and went on to lead an accomplished life.

**MYTH:** People with mental illnesses are dangerous.

**FACT:** The vast majority of those with mental illness are not violent. In the cases when violence does occur, the incidence typically results from the same reasons as with the general public such as feeling threatened or excessive use of alcohol and/or drugs.



Look for a display in Fellowship Hall to "adopt" your garden patch.



Month-end income is better than what was planned by almost \$8,300. Year-to-date income is still short of what was planned, this month by about \$31,000. That income shortfall continues to be offset by our expense savings and results in a year-to-date income to expense gap that is better than what we expected by about \$3,700. Your faithful giving is needed to further improve our year-end results.
