PADS – Our History and Future!

- 2 Many of you know that on Saturday nights between October and April we offer Fellowship Hall as a homeless shelter through PADS. But there is much more to PADS Crisis Services than the emergency overnight shelters that Lake County congregations provide and staff.
- 3 PADS Crisis Services, Inc. began as a Crisis and Referral Hot Line in 1972. Trained workers provided around the clock telephone intervention, information and referrals for many Lake County residents. (This service was discontinued in 2003 because of duplicate services now available in Lake County.)
In 1987, awareness grew of the increasing need to provide emergency overnight shelter for people who were homeless. Modeled after another program, PADS offered shelter, food and hospitality during the cold-weather months of October through April. The first shelter site opened on Christmas Eve in 1987. Today, with the help of congregations county-wide, 15 shelter sites a week are provided, with at least two sites open each night from 7PM to 7AM.
- 4 In 1992, PADS+ Resource Center was opened as the daytime component for homeless individuals, including families with children. In addition to providing basic needs, such as laundry and shower facilities, telephones, mail and message services, PADS+ offers a ladder of opportunity by teaching the skills needed to obtain jobs, housing, further education or independent living. In the summer of 2003 this program was combined with the PADS program and is now known simply as “PADS.” PADS originally stood for Public Action to Deliver Shelter, but has changed its meaning to “Providing Advocacy, Dignity and Shelter.”
- 5 In November of 2004 a long-term dream was realized – summer shelter for families. Designed to fill the needs of the most at-risk on the streets, the new program provides a safe sleeping area and works in conjunction with area soup kitchens that provide meals during the summer months. Another year round site is *A Safe Haven*, 15 beds for the chronically homeless with mental illness. PADS also has a program for providing housing for 10 formerly homeless veterans.
- 6 PADS was housed at the old VA hospital in North Chicago, but recently moved into the old Healthreach building in Waukegan.
- 7 We are proud of our church’s response to the homeless in Lake County. Many other groups help support our Saturday night site: St. Joseph’s Catholic Church, Libertyville Covenant Church, and Islamic Foundation North. We provide all 3 meals (we give our guests a lunch when they leave in the morning), a place to sleep, toiletries and other essentials (i.e., new underwear). **But we are always in need of more volunteers. There are many shifts to work: set-up (5:30-6:15) – which is usually done by youth groups and families with kids; serving (6:30-9:00) and a couple people to stay on until 11; 11-3AM (2 people needed) and 3:00-6:30AM (2 people needed) and clean-up (5:30-7:15).** No one needs to commit to a set schedule – the sign up book is always available on Sunday mornings.

Our site houses men, women and children. Last year we had as many as 19 kids for a couple of nights. The youngest child we have ever had was 2 weeks old. We usually receive about 35-40 guests on the bus from PADS and another 11-15 walk-ins.

How can you help? You can sign up to volunteer at one of the shifts, help cook on the first Saturday of each month, or make a donation. Items that we need: paper products, new underwear (both men and women’s), toiletries, decaf coffee, warm sweaters or coats, etc.

Mental Illness Affects All of Us

- ◆ About one in four persons has a diagnosable mental disorder in a given year.
- ◆ One in seventeen suffers with persistent and severe mental illness, according to the National Institute of Health.
- ◆ Death by suicide is the third leading cause of death for young persons, ages 10-24. Over 90% of those who die by suicide have a diagnosable mental disorder.
- ◆ Four of the ten leading causes of disability are mental disorders.

Did you know?

- ◆ Less than one-third of adults and half of children with a mental disorder receive any mental health services in a given year.
- ◆ People who experience major mental illnesses such as depression, bi-polar disease, schizophrenia, post traumatic stress disorder, anxiety disorders, and others tend to be isolated and marginalized by society. They feel devalued. You can show your support by attending a community service of meditation and candle lighting.

Saturday mornings from 9-12, W2C hosts tutoring sessions in subjects such as math, reading, English, science and Spanish. Each volunteer is scheduled to work with specific student(s) for 50 minute sessions(s). Each coach will be paired with a student and will meet with them monthly to discuss academic progress and to coach them on reaching their goals.
