Building on Our Dreams **Building Committee Plans and Capital Campaign**

In June, the congregation supported the proposal to move forward to the next stage of our plans to remodel our building in light of the hopes and dreams of the church and God's guidance for our future. This next stage includes two important steps:

- ◆ The completion of detailed architectural drawings for a revitalized sanctuary with up-to-date technology designed to accommodate traditional and contemporary worship styles; a new front entrance with a large "fellowship oriented" welcoming and gathering area; and a new second floor ADA compliant restroom.
- ◆ The completion of a Building Fund Campaign to raise the necessary funds to support the project, which is estimated to cost 2-2.5 million dollars.

Both the Building Committee and the Building Fund Campaign Committee have been working hard these last few months to complete their work.

The Building Committee is meeting with our architects in October and early November to refine and complete the detailed drawings and renderings for the project. These detailed plans will give us a clear sense of the final cost of the project and also be presented at a final Church Conference for approval of the project. Anticipated Schedule for the Building Project:

- ◆ **October/November** - Building Committee works with Architects on detailed architectural plans and projected costs
- ◆ **December** - Detailed plans, costs, and results of Capital Campaign considered
- ◆ **January** - Informational Meeting and Update on Building Project
- ◆ **February** - Church Conference for final approval of Building Plan and Costs

The Building Fund Campaign Committee is working with our consultants at the James Company to carry out our Annual Stewardship and 3-Year Building Fund Campaign entitled, Building On Our Dreams. Important Dates in this Campaign are:

- ◆ **October 19 Advance Commitment Gathering** 5:00 pm at the home of Jack and Linda Kraemer, for those who are interested in making an Advance Commitment to the Campaign to lead the way in raising the financial support for the project
- ◆ **November 2 Invitation to Prayer Sunday** During worship we will be invited to pray about our commitment to the future of the church and this project. Everyone will receive their Building on Our Dreams Prayer and Commitment Packets which includes valuable information about the project and Commitment Cards.
- ◆ **November 16 Commitment Sunday - ONE WORSHIP SERVICE AT 9:30 AM and Catered Brunch.** We will offer our commitments to God for Building on Our Dreams! Our Bishop, Rev. Sally Dyck, will be preaching. There will be special music and liturgy in worship. We will have a fabulous catered Brunch following the service. All are welcome!
- ◆ **January 11 Celebration Sunday!** We announce and celebrate our Commitments to date.

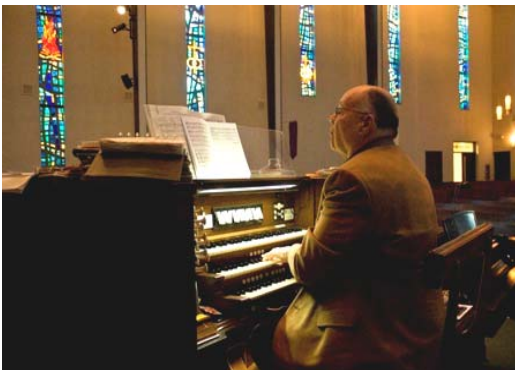

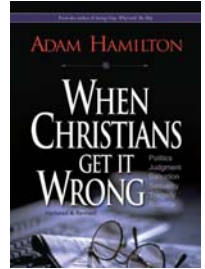

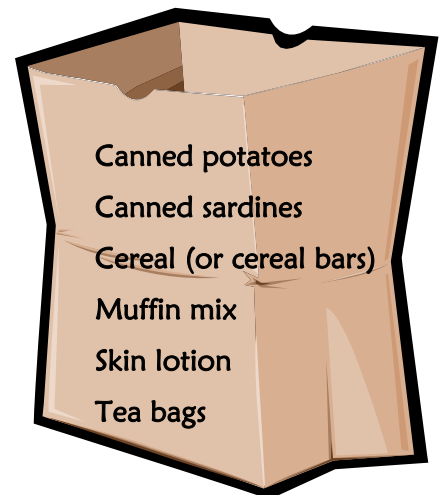
Jesus calls us to feed the hungry!
