



Making Our Dreams Come True Meet Brad Strutz, Our Construction Superintendent

When Brad Strutz arrived at the church this spring to begin our building project, the sign on the outside of the church made him nervous. The sign read, *Building on Our Dreams*. Brad said he thought, “O boy, I got a another mission and those are some high expectations. I hope we can live up to that.”

Brad is the superintendent of our remodeling project. He is the man on the ground who organizes the job and works with the carpenters and sub-contractors to guide the project and make sure everything is done with excellence and efficiency. He’s doing a great job. I thought it would be interesting for you to get to know Brad so I met with him this week to learn a little more about his life, his work and his faith.

I asked him how he got into the construction business. He said when he was 5 years old his family moved into a new subdivision in the south suburban town of Palos Heights. “There wasn’t much to do in this new community,” Brad said, so he and his friends would go into the custom homes that were being built and ask the carpenters for nails and leftover wood so they could build things. They built tree forts and underground forts and rafts to float down the creek nearby. It was fun.

His aunt and uncle owned a big furniture factory in Chicago. They would bring wood home from the shop. When Brad visited them, he’d ask for some nails and a hammer and used the wood to make things. His aunt said, “He’s going to be a carpenter when he grows up.” All Brad’s brothers went to college and into business, becoming successful executives, but that was not for Brad. He wanted to be a carpenter.

In 1976, he got his first job as a carpenter’s assistant and has been working ever since. One of his first projects was to do trim work on Ernie Banks house on the gold coast. At one point, he had his own remodeling business. Brad went to work for Ward Construction 25 years ago when the company was small, with only two carpenters. They have grown and now have over 20 carpenters. Brian Ward is our General Contractor and Brad’s boss. Brad speaks highly of Brian and his leadership.

When Brad talks about his work he says, “It’s all about relationships.” He works with a lot of different people from owners and architects to subcontractors, carpenters and even a pastor or two. He enjoys the relationships. Of the tradespeople and craftsmen he works with he said, “They all want to do a good job. A lot of it comes down to pride. All these guys want to do a good job.”

“What do you like best about what you do?” I asked him.

“For the last fifteen years we’ve worked in churches. Each job is different. There’s a different environment with different people. I like the variety and the challenge of starting a new job, even though I get nervous when I first look at a 50-page set of plans,” he told me. He likes working on churches. He said churches are more lasting than the secular projects like hospitals and office buildings. “It feels good to work on churches. It seems like you have a purpose,” he explained.

Over the last fifteen years, Brad said he’s gotten a lot closer to God. Struggles from going through a divorce after twenty years of marriage, working in churches on building projects and the fact that he was getting older all had an impact on his faith. He grew up a Catholic but in 2005 he began attending Parkview Christian Church in Orland Park. The church of 15,000 members is building a new campus in Frankfort next year. When Brad learned that we didn’t have any place to repurpose the cross from our sanctuary, he spoke to his pastor and

they decided they could use it in the new church. Brad told me, "I know it's just a piece of wood, but thousands of people have prayed to that cross over the years and it would be good if someone else could use it." He enjoys being a part of his church and small group Bible studies. He said, "It's great that everyone helps each other with their struggles and reaches out. It's like being on a good team."

Brad's favorite book of the Bible is Ecclesiastes. He appreciates King Solomon's perspective. "Here was a man who had it all, hundreds of wives, great wealth, the ability to build fabulous buildings, but he realized it didn't bring him satisfaction. I often think of that, these things don't give you true happiness." Brad shared that he'd been very fortunate in his life. He'd always had a good income, was able to buy nice cars, build some great homes but as he's gotten older, he realized that these things aren't that important. "At the end of that story about Solomon having satisfaction," he told me, "it's really about being with God and trying to do good work. That's what's comforting to me, I have them both and we're building churches and that's God's house!" Brad values his work. "I tell the guys all the time, you're working on God's house now. You better get it right or you're in trouble."

At the end our time together Brad told me, "What I like most about my job being in construction, is you can always see what you're building and when you get done, if it comes out really good, like everybody planned, it's all worth it. It's worth the struggle." We know that it will be worth the struggle.

We are grateful to Brad Strutz and his faithful leadership of our building project. We are grateful that he has been called by God to help us *build on our dreams*. May God bless Brad and Brian Ward, our General Contractor, and all the good carpenters and painters and tradesmen who are working so hard each day to help our dreams come true. Thanks be to God!

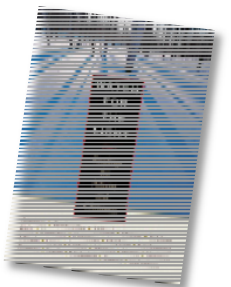
