

## Finance Notes

There have been some questions about the 2015 results after publishing them in the last Memos. Below are some comments from Ron Stouffer, chair of the Resource Committee that should help provide some answers and perspective.

“2015 was a year of excitement, challenge and great accomplishment for our church. As a result of the faith and commitment of our membership we now enjoy a beautiful new front entryway, a modern and inviting sanctuary, improved educational facilities and a gathering room that will help us build upon the fellowship and community we all enjoy. While it was a challenging year financially we continue to be in a solid position with over \$500,000 available for monthly operations, designated uses,

and to help pay down the construction loan. However, due to the disruption from construction, we experienced a decline in attendance and with that a decline in offerings, most notably Non-Pledge Offerings. In total, Revenue was about \$102k below budget. This was not totally unexpected during construction though our budget, developed in late 2014, included the hope we would occupy the new sanctuary earlier thus benefitting from increased attendance and giving. Thankfully the various committees rallied and did an exceptional job managing expenses throughout the year, finishing in aggregate more than \$36k under budget. The efforts of our committees to save on expenses, plus a very strong December month, resulted in a year-end deficit of just \$66,000, well within our ability to absorb. As the Resource Committee looks back at 2015, while challenging financially, we recognize the construction and short-term effect on attendance and giving were very simply an investment in faith. Faith that the mission of our church will be enhanced and the membership inspired by the investment in our beautiful new facilities. As we begin 2016, the Resource Committee has faith we will see a turnaround in both attendance and revenue now that we are worshipping in the new sanctuary. We will also be diligently monitoring the financial situation and will continue to propose potential solutions if and when warranted. There were several bright spots in the 2015 finances. As we have always done, the 2015 apportionments were paid in full. Contributions toward the 3-year Building Fund commitments (totaling \$1.36M) were received ahead of schedule, with almost \$653,000 donated by 12/31/15. That’s almost 50% of our commitments received in the first year.....a testament to the strength of our church! Now that we are worshipping in the new sanctuary and utilizing the new facilities the committee is discussing the timing for a second fundraiser to further reduce (and hopefully eliminate) the outstanding loan amount (currently at \$1,372,282.70).”

"I think the 2016 budget makes a great deal more sense given the comparison to 2014, a year without the disruption in attendance due to construction. It does though demonstrate the need to grow the church and the importance of the investment made in the updated facilities. Overall revenues are up only 8.2% from 2014. Most importantly, the budget demonstrates the commitment of the church to grow its ministries.”
